CONTEST RULES AND ENTRY FORM

1. The contest is open to anyone who lives, works or attends school full time in Palo Alto, Menlo Park, Atherton, Stanford, Portola Valley, Woodside, Mountain View, Los Altos, Los Altos Hills and East Palo Alto.
2. Limit of one entry per person.
3. **Strict word limit of 2,500 words; longer stories will be disqualified.**
4. **Submit five (5) hard copies of your story.**
5. Stories should have a title, but your name should not appear anywhere on the story (only on this entry form, which you must include with your entry, along with your entry fee).
6. Stories should be printed double-spaced with text in 12-point Times Roman font. Copies should be stapled (not paper-clipped) and should not include any artwork. You may print front and back to save paper.
7. \$20 entry fee for all ADULT stories; \$10 entry fee for YOUNG WRITERS under 18. Make checks payable to "Palo Alto Weekly."
8. Entries may not have been previously published.
9. Signed entry form must accompany story.
10. Children under age 12 may enter the contest and will be judged in the 12-14 age category.
11. Preliminary screening of all entries is done by experienced local writers prior to semi-finalists being sent to the contest judges.
